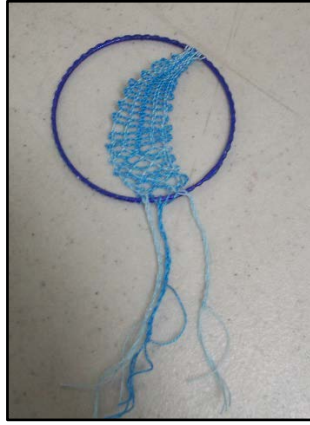

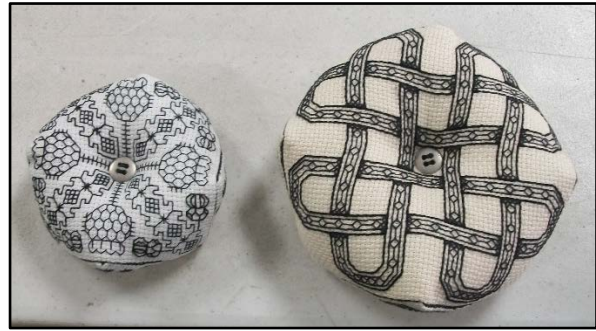

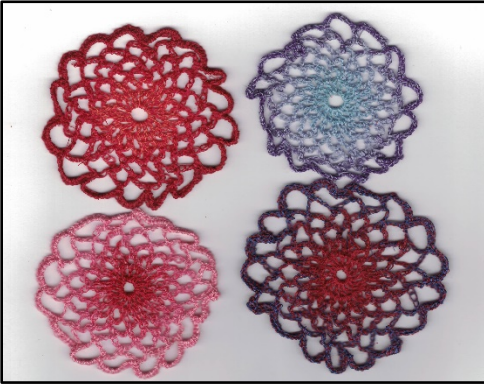

3 Different colors of sewing thread

Crochet hook size 7

6 sewing machine bobbins (can use plastic ones)

Students must wind color #1 onto 3 of the sewing machine bobbins.

Students must wind color #2 onto 3 other sewing machine bobbins.

The third color comes off the original spool of sewing thread.
