This year the Freeway Lace Guild is celebrating its 25<sup>th</sup> Lace Day and we are excited to have the opportunity to share lace with Southern California by offering free beginning level mini workshops in shuttle tatting, needle tatting, bobbin lace, and lace identification with a small registration fee of \$5.00 that includes a goodie bag.

Lace Days are traditional events sponsored by Lace Guilds throughout the United States providing lace exhibits and specialized lace vendors to the public. We include a "Lace Exchange" as well, where those participating trade lace pieces of different techniques with one another; this year our theme is "peace symbols". We also offer a commemorative bobbin painted with a dove. Our displays include guild member's award winning pieces and this year we welcome lacemaker and teacher Kim Davis who will bring a display of her lace. Also very special this year is a wire lace exhibit by artist Lieve Jerger whose copper lace pieces were featured at convention.

We invite anyone who is new to lace to come and visit us and enjoy a free mini workshop starting at 1 PM. Please send us the pre-registration form so that we will have supplies ready for you. We ask that you arrive no later than 12:30 PM so you will be ready to begin class at 1:00 PM. You are welcome to come for the whole day by arriving anytime after 9:45 AM to receive your goodies and enjoy the displays and sales room.

## ***Calling all continuing Lacemakers ages 9 to 99 who would like some help with their lace or want to learn something new in lacemaking of all types...***

Founding Freeway Lace Guild member Jean Doig will be sharing her lacemaking knowledge with us and will offer various mini classes. She can help you get a pattern started or ended, or give you help at any stage of the pattern. She can also inspire you in the areas of tatting, needle lace, embroidered laces and knitted laces. Jean recently published her first book on Netted Lace and of course she would love to share this lace with you as well. Below are the prerequisites for coming to class and best of all the cost is \$00.00 and all you have to do is pre-register for our Lace Day. So come spend some time with Jean and get some help or learn something new. Her schedule for the day is planned as follows:

10:00 AM	<u>Bobbin Lace</u> Participants should have a knowledge of cross & twist and know half stitches and cloth stitches
11:00 AM	<u>Tatting or Knotted Lace including Netted Lace</u> Tatters should have knowledge of the two basic parts to the tatted knot
12:00 Noon	<u>Needle or Embroidered Laces</u> Participants should have a knowledge of couching and buttonhole stitches
1:30 - 2:30 PM	<u>Additional Help</u> - Jean will offer help on your project or repeat an earlier class as needed

Jean will meet with each group, then move on to the next group, allowing lacemakers to stay at their table and continue working. Continuing help can also be given to those who know the basics of embroidery and knitting but want to learn about those laces. If there is anything else that you want to learn including beginning and continuing netting just mark it in the space below. You should bring your tools and ongoing projects.

In addition, Louise Colgan will give individual consultation with lacemakers who have continuing projects and have a question to be answered so they can move on with their work. This is a unique opportunity to have 15 minutes of Louise's time without being in a class with her. Spaces are limited and are not planned for those who are registered for her October or November classes.
