
President's Message



March Program

Hardanger class with **Priscilla Atwell** :

\$2 kit fee plus **\$5** teaching fee to the instructor.

This will be a class on filling the holes rather than just kloster block/satin stitch and button hole stitch/other edgings. Priscilla will provide a bookmark sized canvas (14-30 count) with Kloster blocking already done, threads, needles and instructions. Priscilla will have available magnifying glasses w/lights for the students to use.


